

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)
Regarding the Closure of Pawlan Law, LLC (PLLLC)

1. Why is Pawlan Law LLC closing?

We have made the decision to close PLLLC and its personnel will join Levun Goodman & Cohen, LLP (LGC) to better serve our clients with expanded resources and capabilities.

2. When will the closure take effect?

Our official closure date is December 31, 2025. As of this date, PLLLC resigns from all matters and representations of you, your family and affiliated entities. All future services will be handled through LGC.

3. Can I continue working with my current attorney?

Yes. PLLLC's attorneys are joining LGC and you may continue working with them by signing and return to us LGC's Engagement Agreement and File Transfer Agreement. Others at LGC may also provide services on your matters.

4. What happens if I do not want to join LGC?

You are free to retain another attorney. If so, please let us know and provide us with written authorization so we can transfer your files to your new attorney promptly. Please make this decision as soon as possible to avoid missing any deadlines related to your matter.

5. What happens to my records if I do nothing?

If you do not become a client of LGC, PLLLC will continue to store a copy of your files for a minimum of 3 years after the expiration of any statute of limitations and then your files will be destroyed.

6. Will my fees or billing change?

Any invoices with PLLLC for services performed prior to January 1, 2026 will be billed by and should be paid directly to PLLLC. If continue to use us as we begin with LGC, future billing will be managed by LGC pursuant to the new Engagement Agreement terms.
